

## 20:1 Internship Positions for 2017-18 Academic Year

### **Description:**

20:1 Programs provide a 2-credit internship per semester for Binghamton University undergraduates who are interested in becoming peer educators on the topics of Bystander Intervention and Sexual Assault Prevention. Applicants are automatically entered in the pool for both internships, however, applicants will be asked which internship they would prefer to join during our interview process.

### **Duties:**

- Interns of both programs primarily educate their fellow students on topics of interpersonal violence prevention. Interns use an interactive presentation format to start discussion amongst their peers.
- Active tabling at various events on campus, including the health fair and spring fling.
- Provide outreach to students on campus through “storming,” a process where interns ask students to answer questions about interpersonal violence.
- Attend seminar twice weekly to gain an in-depth understanding of topics related to interpersonal violence
- Other coursework and duties as assigned

### **Requirements:**

- 5 hours/week
- Ability to give presentations on some nights and weekends
- Participation in a 1-day training session immediately prior to the Fall Semester.
- Ability to attend seminar twice a week on Monday & Wednesday.
- Availability in both Fall '17 and Spring '18 semester

Applications are reviewed on a rolling basis until positions are filled. For priority consideration, submit materials by March 15th.

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### **Program Information:**

The 20:1 Sexual Assault Prevention Program discusses the topics of sexual consent and incapacitation. Interns learn how to facilitate discussion on what constitutes consent in New York State, provide realistic examples of consensual and non-consensual encounters, and how to combat victim blaming.

The 20:1 Bystander Intervention Program discusses how to intervene in a situation where a sexual assault is occurring or about to occur. Interns learn how to facilitate discussion on building empathy for victims, the factors that affect intervention, and give participants skills on how to safely intervene.

The name “20:1” represents a national statistic from 2004, when our organization was founded. In 1 hour, approximately 20 women are sexually assaulted in the United States.
