F.A.Q. FOR PARENT-STUDENT CONVERSATIONS

Support your student - quick answers to complex questions



Q: I am X major. Can I study abroad?

A: Yes, of course! You can take major, minor, general education, and/or elective credits while you study abroad. If you cannot fit a full semester into your schedule, you can look into winter, spring break, or summer programs.



Q: When should I study abroad?

A: Most students study abroad in their sophomore or junior years; however, the sooner you start planning, the easier it will be to figure out what works best for you and your degree! Plan to discuss this with your academic advisor.



Q: How much will the program cost?

A: It depends on the program, but there are many affordable ways to study abroad! Shorter programs have lower costs and exchange programs have the same tuition as Binghamton.

Financial aid is generally applicable and scholarships are available.
