Dr. Kamron Pourmand '08, will discuss his path from Binghamton, through medical school to his current career as the Chief Fellow of Gastroenterology at Mount Sinai.

Dr. Pourmand is currently completing his gastroenterology fellowship at Mount Sinai Hospital. He graduated summa cum laude with a bachelor's degree in biological sciences from Binghamton University in 2008. He then graduated from the Stony Brook University School of Medicine in 2012 where he served as class president. He briefly left New York to complete an internal medicine residency at the Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania in 2015.

Dr. Pourmand serves as chief fellow of gastroenterology at Mount Sinai, and will be staying another year to complete a fellowship in transplant hepatology. He enjoys teaching medical students and continues to be heavily involved with medical education since his time at Stony Brook. He has been able to create and institute various medical curricula, participate in educational committees both locally and nationally, and perform educational research over the course of his medical training.
