***EY Leaders are required to have two technical classes beyond the S core and J core classes (Options are listed in degreeworks). Technical electives can count towards a concentration if more than one concentration is declared.

****Admission to the MS Accounting program is not guaranteed. Minimum GPA of 3.0 is required. Requirements are subject to change.
